Themes that speakers will focus on:

- 1- Impacts and implications of climate change in maritime regions: concrete examples
- 2- What their region is doing to address and prevent risks presented by climate change (both coastal and inland risks), for instance via:
 - Better planning and coastal management (e.g. identification of risks, revision of planning frameworks, adaptation strategies, development of coastal strategies, land-sea interactions, cooperation with local communities and national authorities on planning etc)
 - Cooperation with other regions (ex. Bologna Charter): including identification of needs for future cooperation
 - Strategies for innovation and economic development to explore opportunities for economic benefits from climate adaptation
- 3- Transferability of good practices between CPMR regions
- 4- How impacts of geo-hazards and extreme weather events are compensated at regional level
- 5- How the EU could provide better support to the regions via:
 - Its regulations and policy frameworks (e.g. are the regions happy with their involvement in the implementation of the MSP directive? Should the EU do something else?)
 - Its programmes: should anything be improved in the Solidarity Fund & how these coastal issues should be covered in future Interreg programmes or through other Structural Investment Fund programmes for instance?
